## Our 40th Anniversary Species List

The species are listed by the month that the first of its kind came through our doors, and they are in order of admittance for that month. A patient phenology, if you will.

For example, even though we admitted several Yellow-bellied Sapsuckers (27), the first one of the year was admitted in January so that's where you'll find the listing. It's fascinating that at least one new species was admitted every month of the year.

There were some big milestones this year: Most patients in history (we may break 15,000!) 183 different species (as of 12/9/2019) Eight months broke historical monthly records and are indicated in red and by the \*.

We'll add December to this listing after the first of the year.
